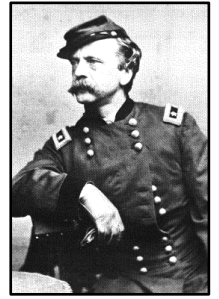

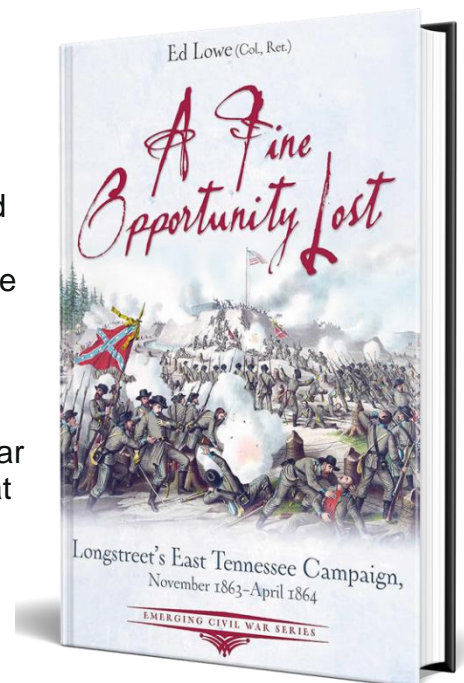

Old Warhorse vs. Redemption Seeker, the clash between James Longstreet and Ambrose Burnside unfolds in the Western Theater, shaping the fate of East Tennessee and Chattanooga during the Civil War.

Longstreet, Robert E. Lee's "Old Warhorse," had long labored in the shadow of both his army commander and the late Thomas J. "Stonewall" Jackson. When Confederate fortunes took a turn for the worse in Tennessee, both Jefferson Davis and General Lee dispatched Longstreet and most of his First Corps to reinforce Braxton Bragg's ill-starred Army of Tennessee. Within hours of his arrival, Longstreet helped win the decisive victory at Chickamauga and drove the Union Army of the Cumberland back into Chattanooga. For a host of reasons, both military and political, Bragg dispatched Longstreet and his troops... to East Tennessee.

Waiting for him there was Ambrose Burnside, whose early-war success had long-ago melted away with his disastrous loss at Fredericksburg in late 1862. Longstreet finally had the opportunity to display his tactical and operational skills. The two old foes found themselves transplanted to unfamiliar ground, with the fate of East Tennessee, Chattanooga, and the reputations of the commanders, hanging in the balance.
