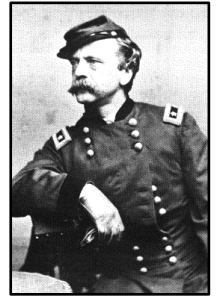

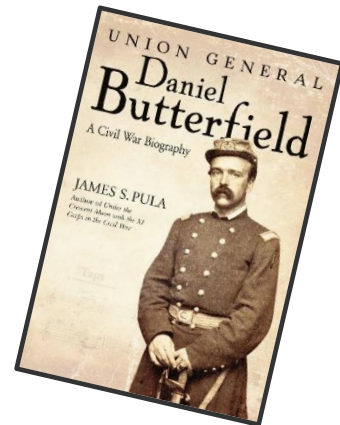
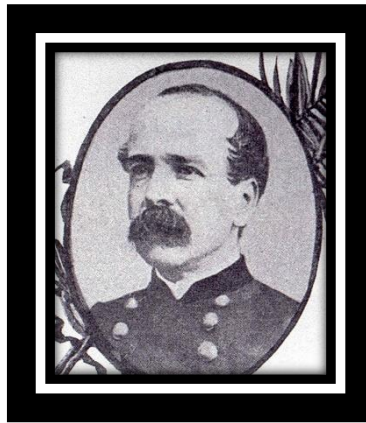
Union General Daniel Butterfield A Civil War Biography

Dan Butterfield played a pivotal role during the Civil War. He was also controversial, not well-liked by some, and tainted by politics. Born into a wealthy New York family (his father co-founded American Express) he was one of the war's early volunteers and made an important contribution with his manual *Camp and Outpost Duty for Infantry*. He gained praise leading a brigade on the Virginia Peninsula and was wounded at Gaines' Mill, where his heroism would earn him the Medal of Honor. He commanded a division at Second Bull Run and did so with steadiness and intelligence. He would lead the Fifth Corps during the bloodbath at Fredericksburg, where he was charged with managing the dangerous withdrawal across the Rappahannock River. Always placed where needed, it seems Daniel Butterfield never achieved the level of success he wanted.
